The ger (refugee, vulnerable migrant, foreigner, sojourner, alien)



Dominant ethical concerns of Deuteronomy:

1. Slavery: providing pathways out; protecting rights

2. Widows, orphans, foreigners/ refugees: providing safety and ensuring survival



Deuteronomy 10:15,17-19

The Lord showed his love to your ancestors....The Lord your God...shows no partiality and accepts no bribes. He defends the cause of the fatherless and the widow and loves the foreigner residing among you, giving them food and clothing. And you are to love those who are foreigners, for you yourselves were foreigners in Egypt.



1. Steadfast loyalty (solidarity of a treaty) 2. Kinship belonging (solidarity of a family) 3. Emotional connection (solidarity of feeling)
