

"Blessed are" (blessing)

eulogeo - God's empowerment/gifting of people and creation

makarios - recognition of someone's status or honour by the community

See: "How Honorable! How Shameful" by KC Hanson

Honour: a claim to status affirmed by the community; how you are perceived

- received on basis of identity
- achieved on basis of competition
- determined your treatment at all times
- a limited commodity
- traits: aggression, boldness, authority

Shame: loss of status, regard, or worth in the community; humiliation

traits: submission, deference, vulnerability to shame



The Beatitudes "are undoing the shame which disciples suffered on his behalf....Jesus revalues what has been disvalued; he honours what has been shamed"

-Jerome Neyrey in Honour and Shame in Matthew

The Beatitudes are a new honour code.

- How honourable are those who lack honour
- Honour is replenished as it is poured out
- Honour is not received by shaming others
- We follow Jesus, who embraced social shame
